
## APPOINT MANAGER TO RUN CITY BUSINESS

Experiment in Municipal Government eing Tried by Dayton, Ohio

Dayton, Ohio, has begun an experiment in city government which will be watched with close attention, says the Toronto World in discussing the question of city government by manager. It has placed the conduct of affairs under Mr. Henry M. Waite as city manager, and made him accountable for his action in that capacity to the city commissioners. The new system is frankly based on the method employed in great business corporations, where the shareholders elect the directors, and these in turn appoint the executive head of the concern. 
