SALVOR OFF TO ALBERT

The steamer Salvor, of the B.G. Salvage Co., arrived in Prince Rupert last evening en route to the wreck of the Prince Albert to inspect the possibilities of pulling the ship off the rock. She had aboard Capt. Logan, the representative of Lloyd's, and the chief engineer of the G. T. P. Steamship Company. Capt. Nicholson, manager of the G. T. P. Steamship Company, who came in on the Princess Royal, joined the Salvor here. The steamer left this morning for the wreck. The Salvor is in command of Capt. Stratford, who was the first pilot on the Prince Rupert.

LITTLE COAL IN SIGHT

There is very little coal on the waterfront today. The Government and Grand Trunk main docks are swept clean of coal and there is practically no coal in sight.

Over on the Digby Island dock there is over 100 tons but guards are stationed there with orders to cut away the decking and let the coal into the water should a German craft make her appearance.

NO ANNOUNCEMENT YET

General Superintendent W. C. C. Mehan stated to The News this morning that no official announcement has yet been made as to the opening of the road through to Fort George and the East. His department is practically ready at any time and he is waiting news from the East as to what service they require. It is probable that an announcement will be made in a few days and a service may start about Sept. 1st.

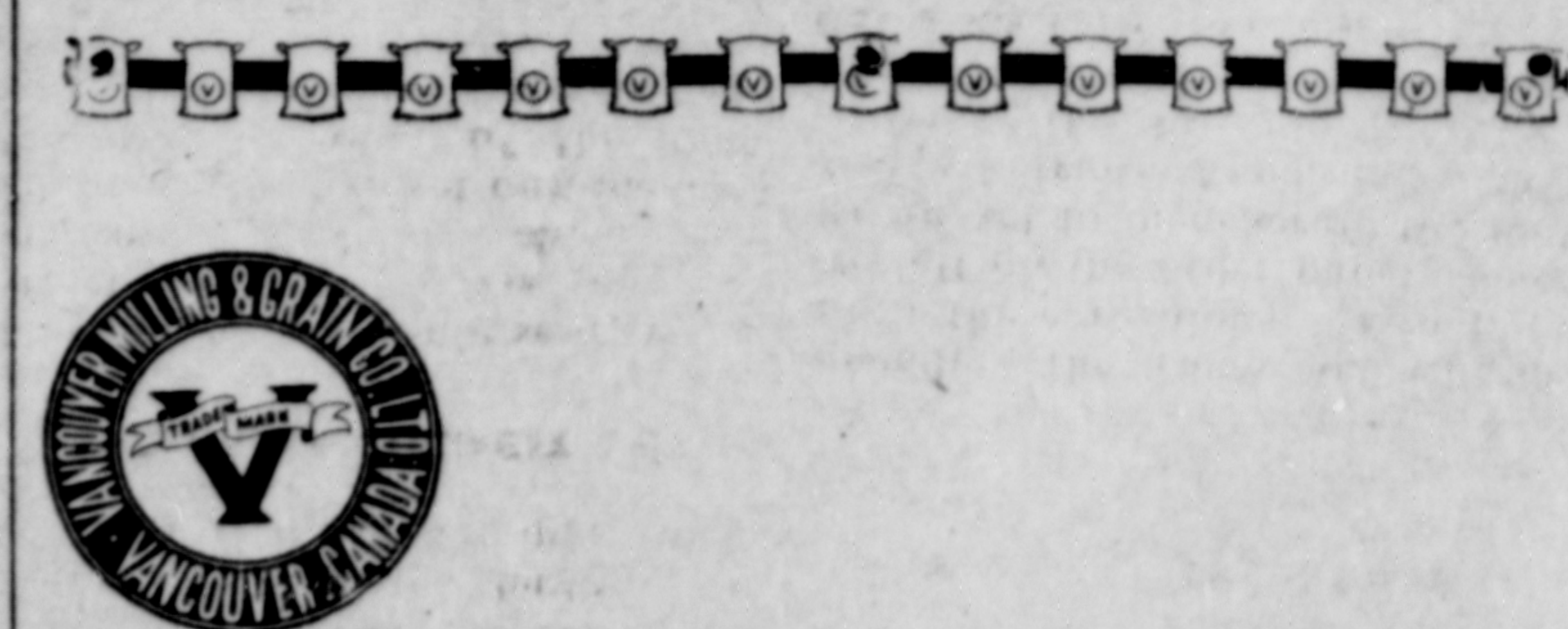

GERMANY IS GROWING HUNGRY—FOOD SCARCITY

London, August 22.—German papers received here indicate that economic disturbances in the Fatherland are already having a disastrous effect. The pinch of food scarcity is being felt in Berlin and other large towns. The police had to intervene in some places between the provisioners and customers. Not only is Germany practically cut off from the rest of the world, but various parts of the empire are suffering by the entire disruption of railway service.

COST \$30,000,000 IN EIGHT MONTHS
