#### LONDON, May 17.—Thirty Billion dollars is the amount set by the Supreme Council of the Allies as a round sum to be paid by Germany. This was done, it is understood, on the initiative of Great Britain and at the request of Germany.

For some time there was a difference in regard to it between Premier Lloyd George and Millerand of France, but this was cleared up at the week-end and the general principle of a lump sum payment conceded.
