



London, July 26 .-- The American steamer Leelanlaw, from Archangel to Belfast with a cargo of flax, has been torpedoed off the north coast of Scotland. The Brit. ish steamer Brangewood, 3,000 tons, from Archangel to France. has also been sunk. Both crews were landed.

BRITISH SUBMARINES REACH CONSTANTINOPLE

London, July 26 .- A British submarine has returned to the Dardanelles, having penetrated Constantinople harbor, sinking two gun-boats and a steamship. Another submarine sank a transport and blew up the wharf at Tophane, near Constantinople.
