## BRITISH ARE ON OFFENSIVE ON THE ANCRE

German Withdrawal is More Rapid Than Expected-Bombardment Terrific-Rain Storms Impede.

(Special to The Daily News.)

London, March 16 .- The German retirement is stiffening. The German withdrawal has changed to a British offensive. The terrific bombardment is forcing the evacuation of the Germans from positions where they made a stand. The belief exists that the Germans have already evacuated Bapaume and are falling back on the line chosen by Hindenberg from Lens, St. Quentin and Laon. The withdrawal is already becoming more rapid than was anticipated. The British advance continues in the face of a blinding rain storm and a veritable sea of mud and has progressed on a front of a mile and a half immediately to the west of Bapaume.
