Now that the elections are over it will be well for citizens to begin to consider how they are going to house the people who may be expected to come here during the next few months. The demand for houses will be very great and there is talk of knockdown shacks and all sorts of fragile structures to accommodate |* the workmen at the new plant.

That there are a number of contractors and others already considering the scheme is well known. Already figures are being |* obtained for lumber and building and it is found that the houses |* can be built locally much better than by bringing in ready-made houses.

The biggest demand will be for four and five roomed cottages. Besides this, however, it will be necessary to have some of the |* better class of dwellings for which people will be willing to pay larger rents. Right now there is a demand if the prices are not too high.

Prices of Lots

Must Not be High.

Those who own lots and who wish to sell must not expect to get enhanced prices, for workingmen cannot afford to pay any fancy figures for houses and lots. The lots on which workmen's cottages are built should not cost much more than two to three land:hundred dollars or else the rent comes too high. Prince Rupert must be made a place where people can live as cheaply as else- the north boundary of Lot 2353, with the where or perhaps a little cheaper. That is the only way to attract workingmen. Big prices for everything will only drive people away.

Those who have the interests of the town at heart will try to keep prices down to a reasonable level. The grocers are already doing that. During the Christmas holidays things were cheaper here than they were in Vancouver or Victoria. We still charge high for a few luxuries but the prices will reach a normal level when the influx comes and there is more competition.
