For 1918 the imports were valued at \$1,906,906 and the exports at \$4,242,740. In 1916 the imports were only \$1,205,322, while the exports were about the same. In 1917 the exports dropped off slightly.

In 1916 Prince Rupert was the third city in the province in imports and the second in exports. Last year she was fourth in imports, Nanaimo having ousted her from third place, and in exports she fell back to fifth place, New Westminster having jumped up to over eight million dollars.

While Prince Rupert has been practically standing still the other places have been going ahead.
