Stealing

"Every who is found guilty o stealing any automobile or motor thirty-five shall not apply or extend to any such person, and sentence in any such case shall it be suspended without the concurrence of the Attorney General or his agent, or of the counsel acting for the Crown in the prosecution of the offender.

"Every one under" the age of twenty-one years who is guilty o theft, in addition to any sother punishment to which he may be liable, shall also be liable to be spanked.
