President Hoover Given Great Reception on Giving Address at Cleveland

### Demos Scored

Satisfied If Issue is Settled on Records Instead of Eloquence

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Oct. 17:-Reiterating his belief that in the war against depression "retreat" had been changed to "advance," President Herbert Hoover, delivering the second major address of his campaign for re-election here Saturday night, appealed for a renewal of mandate in order to carry on to completion the policies which, he declared, would bring complete recovery to the United States. Mr. Hoover made a vigorous defence of his administration and its achievements and declared that the Demo-Congress for two years, had entirely failed to propose anything of a beneficial nature during a period when constructive statesmanship had been most urgently needed.

The president reviewed at length his administration's program of economic relief which he claimed had saved the country from inward national ruin. He presented a 12point program designed to remedy unemployment and forestall national chaos. Mr. Hoover expressed himself as being in favor of the holding up of wages to the highest possible level so that the buying power of the people might be maintained. Partial employment was preferable to plunging people into complete unemployment.

Mr. Hoover contradicted the assertion of Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt and other of the Democratic speakers that the world depression had originated in the United States and had been brought about by the economic policies of the administration. The depression had developed from causes over which no single nation had control, the president declared.

He was satisfied to leave the issue to the nation to decide on the basis of records rather than eloquence, the president stated in
