Pilot of the new plane for the flight out from Winnipeg is North Sawle, chief check pilot, for Canadian Pacific Airlines, and James McGuire of the Fort St. John-Vancouver run is acting as first officer.

What disposition will be made of the Barclay-Grow seaplane, which has been used as a relief plane here for some time but which has not carried passengers, is not known.
