

The coho pack so far has been 3,829 cases, of which 3,395 came from District One, with 174 being packed on the Skeena and 260 in southern areas, of District Two. Of the 31 cases of pinks packed so far, 27 were packed on the Skeena, while the chum pack of 482 cases to date has been put up wholly in District Two canneries, 463 of them on the Skeena.

The salmon pack, all types, in the Skeena and Naas River areas for the first week of the season may forecast the trend for the rest of the season. In comparison with the same period of the earlier years it seems to be fairly good. 1947—9,571 cases: 1946-9,216 cases; 1945-22,513 cases; 1944-9,192 cases; 1943-6,663 cases; 1942—12,261.

Sockeye catches in the Smiths and Rivers Inlet areas were reported to be very good this week while the Naas was good and the Skeena fair. The Skeena! fishermen have been averaging 20 to 30 fish daily with Wednesday setting what must be about! the week's daily average of 24. On the Naas, daily averages have been a little better than 30 fish.


