PARIS, April 26 .- (By Canadian Press) .- The four-year term of the present Chamber of Deputies being up this year, Premier Poincare has decided to appeal to the country on May 11. In doing so he has not been without courage, because most of the members favored an extension of the life of this Parliament until the spring of 1925.
