### RENNELL IS TOTAL LOSS

Well Known Halibut Schooner Sank in Wright Sound—Crew Arrive Here Safely

The Canadian halibut schooner Rennell is a total loss having sunk last week in the deep waters of Wright Sound this side of Butedale. The crew have arrived safely in port.

Telling of the loss of the boat, Capt. Ed. Anderson, her master, said this morning that last Tuesday, while running in from a storm on Heceta Straits where he and his men were fishing, the Rennell struck a rock on the south end of Estevan Island which lies south of Banks Island.

They immediately put in to Cow Harbor, Aristazabal Island, where the boat was put on a grid and temporary repairs effected.

They spent two days there and then proceeded with the boat to Butedale where the catch of 2,000 pounds was sold.

Then Thursday night they set out for Prince Rupert, the boat still in a leaking condition but considered fit to make the trip.

Early Friday morning, while travelling, the exhaust pipe gave way and the engine stopped. An attempt was made to make repairs but, before this could be done, the water got too much of a headway and the boat sank.

Saving their effects, the crew took to a boat and made shore where they spent the night, being exhausted.

The next morning they towed 15 miles to Lowe Inlet where they boarded the steamer Chilkoot arriving here on Sunday.

The Rennell, which was a boat of 14 tons and about 50 feet long, was owned by Reginald Beaumont, Capt. C. H. Nicholson and others.

She had been fishing out of here for some eight years.

She had a 20 horse power Frisco Standard gas engine. Just before leaving on the last trip, the vessel had been in dry dock for repairs.

The boat was insured.

Other members of the crew besides Capt. Anderson were Jack Fox, Hugh McGinnis and Ben Johnson.

Arrangements to stage a boxing match here between Brick Skinner of the city and Harold Blanton of Hyder fell through but an announcement is now made that Joe Manilla of Ketchikan will be here on September 11 for a meeting with the local man. It will be Manilla's first appearance here but he is pretty well known for he has been cutting quite a swath in Alaska during the past year and has had many bouts, a large number of which he won.
