# JAPAN REVISES BANKING LAWS

Commissioner Plans Survey of Other Nations' Methods.

TOKYO, July 22.—Revision of the banking laws and other laws regulating finance in Japan is to be undertaken following a prolonged period of investigation and study by a commission appointed by the government for this purpose. It is possible that the results of the investigation will lead to a drastic revision of the existing system of official and semi-official banks as well.

The commission, which is headed by Administrative Vice-Minister of Finance Den, will study the monetary systems of other nations with the view of obtaining ideas that will be practical and beneficial in Japan.

There is need for improvement in the laws regulating finance in Japan, according to Mr. Den. Existing regulations, which were made as the occasion required, are not adequate to the needs of the country and must be amended, improved and codified, he says. He believes this to be a matter of urgent importance for Japan at this time when the nation's economics and finances are proceeding gradually toward rehabilitation and the industrial development of the Empire is outgrowing its garments of former years.
