Prices will be lower shortly unless the weather turns wet. Rhubarb from Terrace is coming in plentifully now. The price is four pounds for 25c and the quality is good. This line has almost entirely displaced apples, which are out of reach and very scarce, as a dessert food.

The sugar market is firm at present prices with advances expected. Eastern markets advanced twenty per cent per hundred about ten days ago but that advance has not yet been followed by British Columbia refiners.
