this is not exactly gardening weather, it is the time of year when people should be planning their gardens for the coming season. Cultivation should commence as soon as weather permits.


The soil in the garden must be dug and cultivated again and again for one purpose, that of ventilation. This idea Joesn't often occur to the gardener laboriously plying a spading fork or hoe, but that is what he is doing. He is tentilating his soil to let the air into it and to expose as

much of it as possible to the sun. Every spade or forkful turned over exposes that much more of the soil to the sun and to the air and makes the soil more accessible to the air to a greater depth.

Effort Will Be Made to Encourage Beautifying City This Season







SOW EARLY IN ROCK GARDENS

Help Them Germinate

Frost has an active part in spurring many seeds into germination. This fact is one of the modern discoveries of horticulture. It was brought into prominence through rock gardening interests which found that many alpine seeds needed to be frozen and snow covered to germinate freely and quickly. As rock gardening has become a very important development in gardening, the raising of rock plants from seed has attracted much study and attention.

Many of these rock garden plants are easily raised from seed if subjected to weathering.




