Flying Near Crimea Peninsula Where He Has Many Adventures.

SHOT DOWN HIS FIRST BOLSHEVIK MACHINE

Confirms Reports of Atrocities and Says They Mutilate Prisoners.

Col. Raymond Collishaw of Nanaimo is now doing duty with a British squadron near the Crimea in Southern Russia. He writes to a friend in Toronto in part as follows:

"Our squadron is the only British unit on this front and we are having some session. During the offensive operations by General Denikine's volunteer army my pilots were 'full out' and most of the eredit has been given to our squadron for the 'ground strafing' and bombing shows we entertained them with. The volunteer army have a couple of flights. Frequently machines from both sides land on enemy territory to exchange ideas.

"In the areas where there are no railways the opposing armies seem to fraternize. The volunteer army is clothed entirely in khaki with British G. S. buttons, equipped in fact, with everything British except ideas.

Largely Cossack.

"The personnel of the volunteer army is largely Cossack, with a sprinkling of refugee Russian officers, who are really fine fellows. In this country everyone is fighting everyone else. Little armies all over the place, the main three being Denikine's in South Russia; Kolchak's in East Russia, and Gregoroff's in the vicinity of Odessa. Gregoroff used to be a Bolshevik colonel and has changed his ideas three times already. Now he is fighting the Bolsheviks, but he is not with General Denikine. Outfits known as the Green Guards also abound. They are simply bands of outlaws and belong to no side. One's life is worth about a dollar in this country.

No Officers.

"The Bolshies have no officers, merely civilians directing the different parties. There are no laws or regulations. The Russians actually drink petrol! So one can imagine what happens when they
