The price of fish at the present time is 17 cents per pound for large king salmon in Ketchikan and 14 cents on the grounds, 10 cents for smalls in Ketchikan and 7 cents on the grounds, and 6 cents for whites in Ketchikan and 5 cents on the grounds, with 40 cents each for troll caught cohoes in Ketchi-

kan and 25 cents on the grounds. No official word has been received here of the result of the meeting, but boats from Port Alexander declare that there was no strike vote but that it was possible some of the boats might decide not to fish for a time.
