# EMBARGO ON

Lettuce, Celery, Cabbage and Bunch Carrots Scarce Owing to Foot and Mouth Disease

On account of an epidemic of foot and mouth disease in four of the western states, including California, Arizona and Oregon, an embargo has been placed on the importation of fresh vegetables from the states affected. As a result there is an acute shortage of fresh lettuce, celery, cabbage and bunch carrots and, as British Columbia stocks are not yet ready for market, it is expected that all supplies will be cleaned up this week. Of course prices are high.
