telegram has reached the city Indian Witnesses Give Story of Tragedy at Port Essington When Native Girl is Alleged to Have Slain Baby

> Preliminary trial of Nina Spalding, nineteen year old Indian girl, charged with the murder of her nine-month old infant son in the graveyard at Port Essington couple of months ago, is proceeding today in provincial police court before Stipendiary Magistrate Andrew Thompson. This morning a number of Indian witnesses, several of them relatives of the accused. were heard. 
