Rising Out of Ashes

CALGARY, Dec. 12: (CP)-One week after forest flames had destroyed ranch homes and buildperial Order, Daughters of the ings, causing lose of \$200,000 to Empire, was a highly enjoyable Bow Valley ranchers, rehabilita-

Aided by a newspaper relief fund, lumber was obtained and transported fere to the disasterstricken district and an immediate start made on the re-building of destroyed homes

The fire swept a 100,000-acre district Thursday, November 19. On Nevember 26 timbers for the first home had been placed early in the morning and, with volunteer carpenters and joiners at work, by nightfall walls had been started.

By mutual agreement the ranchers, in a race against wintry weather, agreed the home of Arthur Coelon, 10 miles southwest of Cochrane, should be re-built first. Other homes will be started hortly.

Coelon, who with his wife and 12-year old twin sons, had a narrow escape when the flames raged across his ranch, suffered a property loss of \$9,000.

"I can hardly believe it's true." he said as he busied himself with hammer and saw aiding the volun-1 teer carpenters. "It looked like a hopeless proposition. Today our new home is under way and best of all it won't have a mortgage on it."

Was Like Ware

The wall of flame which raced down Bow Valley, which he witnessed from a hillside, brought back rare memories to Coelon, a veteran of the Tenth Battalion Canadian Expeditionary Force. "It reminded me of the barrage that was put over on the morning of April 9, 1917, when we took Vimy Ridge except that the noise of guns was absent," he said. "I got my family in the old car. Three miles away we stopped and looked back. Our house and barns were n flames."

The cash fund has grown to more than \$2,000. Lumber companies have given a generous price reduction and transportation companies supplied trucks without parge for the 35 mile trip from Calgary. Furniture, bedding and kitchen utensils were also donated in large quantity.
