
Airmen Defend Malta and Attack Axis Centres from Island Stronghold

At the suggestion of Aid. 11. M. Daggett, chairman of the special fuel committee, the city council last night decided to advertise for tenders for a supply of wood in connection with the city's endeavour to assist in meeting the fuel shortage which is anticipated during the coming winter.

Tests of operation of the new LaFrance fire truck for the city having proven satisfactory, the equipment has been accepted as being up to contract and the city council last night, on recommendation of the utilities committee, authorized payment of \$10,645, the cost of the vehicle.

A fire alarm from a box at the corner of Second Avenue and Second Street, which turned out to be false, brought out the Fire Department at 2 o'clock this morning. Investigation by firemen and police failed to reveal who had turned in the alarm.

The Poole Construction Co. will be granted a lease on lot 7, block 14, section 1, on the regular basis of six percent per annum of assessed value but the company is being advised that no sewer connection is available and sanitary arrangements subject to the satisfaction of the sanitary inspector must be made. A recommendation to this effect from the board of works was adopted by the city council last night.
