> There are numerous ways of vour. preparing vegetables besides plain boiled, steamed or baked. They may be served as escallopped dishes, souffles, croquettes or stuffed. For the stuffing, use other vegetables or a savoury filling.

Another quick and easy methed of cooking vegetables, is called "panning." For each quart of prepared vegetable allow two tablespoons of mild - flavoured fat or drippings. Melt the fat in a heavy flat pan, add the vegetables and cover closely to retain the steam. Cook slowly until tender, but not mushy. Stir occasionally to prevent sticking. When ready to serve, season with salt and pepper to taste.
