

PARIS ()-In spite of the summer's drought, French wine production in 1949 is likely to be higher than in any year since the end of the war.

The industry has so far recovered that production, now Sept. 11-Savoy vs. Commer- nearing the pre-war level, is today less a problem than its export and sale

The alcoholic content of the 1949 crop is also likely to be above normal—an important factor for export because some foreign markets demand a high alcoholic content. Low alcoholic content was responsible for example, for reduced imports by Switzerland and Belgium last year.


