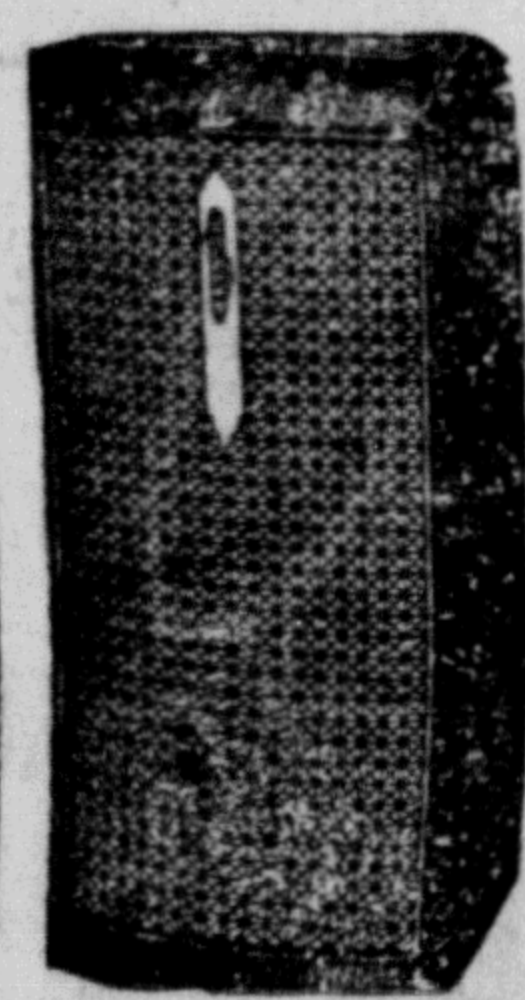

Because of this she almost never passes. Give her a few picture cards and a little distribution and she'll bid her head off.

In today's hand Miss Brash had no more business insisting on three no trump than the man in the moon. But like many overbidders she plays her cards well and is a shrewd judge of the

whims and weaknesses of her opponents.

Notice how Mr. Masters plays down his cards when Miss Brash is his partner. For every one of his bids today he had a little "left over." And yet Miss Brash still reached a highly speculative contract.

West opened the six of diamonds and Miss Brash looked the situation over. She knew West was a deliberate player—and not too quick a thinker. So she won the first trick with the ace of diamonds and without wasting a second banged down the queen of clubs. West did not wince, frown or squirm but played the deuce of clubs calmly and without delay.

"He can't have the king," thought Miss Brash. So she bounced up with the ace in dummy and dropped East's singleton. Both East and West were considerably upset by this play—so much so that when the next club was led West revoked, playing a small spade.

Thus Miss Brash won six clubs, three spades and the ace of diamonds for ten tricks. To this she added two more tricks as the penalty for the revoke—twelve tricks in all.

"A small slam partner," said Miss Brash brightly.

"And I'm very surprised," said West sarcastically, "that you didn't bid it."
