

The dikes will be so wide, they say, that no bomb could break them open or do more than limited damage.

A plan for its construction was drawn up in 1947. Its estimated cost at that time was about \$7,500,000. The plan calls for construction of two large sea basins, many acres of buildings and workshops, a score of double-sided berths for warships of all sizes, a floating dry dock to hold the largest known battleship and huge protecting dikes. The work is going on in the





