**BLACKWOOD on Bridge**

**South Bids Shorter of Best Suits First And Everything Works Out Just Dandy**

Special problems arise in choosing which suit to bid first when you have two biddable suits. Sometimes it is advisable to bid a four-card suit before a five-carder as Mr. Dale did in this deal.

His prime purpose was to get his full story told while taking the least chance of getting the hand too high. Bidding the spades first would give him an opportunity to play at the two level if his partner had a weak hand and a preference for hearts.

Putting it the other way around, supposing Mr. Dale had opened with one heart and Mr. Masters had responded with two diamonds. Now a two-spade bid by Mr. Dale would force Mr. Masters to bid at the three range if he liked hearts better than spades.

**5-CARD SUIT REBID**

Notice that Mr. Masters chose the suit Mr. Dale had bid secondarily for the final contract, in spite of the fact that he held exactly the same cards in both major suits. He knew Mr. Dale had a five-card heart suit because the suit was rebid, but under modern bidding methods Mr. Dale MIGHT have only four spades.

Mr. Dale had to play carefully to make his bid. He had a trump opening and won the first trick with the king of hearts. He realized that unless the spade suit broke 3-3 there was a chance of losing two tricks in the suit.

**TWO FINESSES**

Before playing any more trumps he led a diamond and

successfully finessed the queen. Next he finessed the queen of spades and lost to the king. Mrs. Keen returned a trump and Mr. Abel's 10 forced the ace.

Now a small spade was led to the jack and dummy's last spade returned. It made no difference whether Mr. Abel took his good queen of trumps now or later. Actually he elected to sluff a club and Mr. Dale won with the ace of spades, played his last spade and ruffed it with dummy's jack of hearts.

Mr. Abel overruffed with the queen but the ace of clubs was the only other winner the defenders could cash.

**Civic Centre Given Lease**

Status of Part of Property It Occupies Settled at Long Last

After negotiations which have extended over four years, the provincial government has decided to offer a 2 1/2 year lease at a rental of \$25 per year to the Prince Rupert Civic Centre Association on five lots on which the Civic Centre has had an unsecure tenure. Civic Centre authorities were advised yesterday of the offer by J. D. McRae, MLA.

Actually the Civic Centre occupies ten lots—five facing on Second Avenue at McBride Street and five facing on First Avenue. The five lots on Second Avenue were secured from the city but, until now, the situation as to the lots on First Avenue was unsettled.

The latter lots had been expropriated during the war by the Dominion government from the provincial government as a site for the war services building which later became the Civic Centre.

The Civic Centre Association had long sought to purchase or lease the lots.
